Despite the national lockdown due to COVID19, participation in physical activity at St Martin's was promoted throughout the year.

The following are the numbers of children engaging in enrichment and after school activities funded from the Sports Premium:

Of the children who did not attend, some are living a long way from school but still participating in sports or more general physical activity.

For the vast majority of weeks, a club involving physical activity was held every night of the week.

After the start of the lockdown, we worked with Bishop Challoner to promote physical activity at home. One of our Year 5 children won the overall award for the child who engaged the most in Birmingham during lockdown.

Swimming could not take place in the year 2019-2020.

Issues for 2020-2021

- Investigate reasons why some children do not engage.
- Invest in wider range of lunchtime equipment to promote engagement.
- Extend lunchtime to provide more time for physical activity.
